

A PETITION

To: President George W. Bush and Attorney General John Ashcroft, United States Department of Justice

Whereas the First Amendment to our Constitution says, “**Congress shall make no laws respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press, or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances;**”

We, the undersigned, are exercising that right to “petition the government for a redress of grievances.” We are exercising our “freedom of speech” to object and speak out against “white-collar pornographers” that pander pornographic materials not protected by the First Amendment. The Constitution does not give anyone, including white-collar pornographers, the right to pander obscenity. We the people strongly support you in fulfilling your sworn duty to uphold federal laws, including those governing the distribution of obscenity, and encourage you to do everything within your powers to protect the men, women, children and families of our communities from the proven harms of pornography.

We request that enforcement of federal obscenity laws be among the highest priorities for the United States Department of Justice.
